Martin M. Simons MAAA, ACAS, FCA (Marty) provides P&C insurance actuarial consulting to regulators, legislators, state agencies, and consumers throughout the United States and Canada, and has also testified for State Farm Mutual, Zurich Insurance Companies, Travelers Insurance, the Massachusetts Fair Plan, the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund, the California Earthquake Authority and ABC News. He has provided expert testimony regarding all lines of P&C insurance, including workers' compensation, surety, catastrophe (earthquake, hurricane, sinkhole), homeowners, automobile, general, asbestos, environmental and malpractice liability insurance, economic and rate of return on equity analyses.

He recently ended nine years on the Actuarial Standards Board's General Committee. He serves on the Extreme Events Committee of the American Academy of Actuaries. He is a regular Facilitator for the Casualty Actuarial Society's Course on Professionalism Education.

Since 1997, he has been the lead actuary on the Professional Team of the Florida Commission on Hurricane Loss Projection Methodology, and was the senior member of the Advisory Committee to the Hawaii Hurricane Relief Fund from its creation following Hurricane Iniki in 1992. He served the Fund throughout its existence, and was involved in approving the industry filing to take back the hurricane risk,

Marty served the California Earthquake Authority in actuarial and financial areas and he assisted Florida State University in a study of sinkhole insurance. He testified on behalf of the Massachusetts FAIR Plan regarding their use of hurricane models in making property insurance rates.

Prior to his consulting work, he held actuarial, financial, marketing and branch management positions with the insurance industry. From 1985 to 1997, he was the Deputy Director and Chief Actuary for the South Carolina Department of Insurance and was the PC Actuary for the Hawaii Insurance Division for twenty-seven years.

Marty has also provided actuarial consulting to the Consumer Advocates and Second Injury Funds. He served on several committees of the (NAIC), and has authored several articles and papers on ratemaking, regulation, catastrophe modeling and insurance company profitability.
